

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1 The heat pump challenge


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Carbon emissions from homes need to drop by 47-62% by 2035







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The good, the bad and the ugly

Good: End-date for installing fossil
heating (if confirmed through regulation)

□ Good: Reform of electricity levies

Potentially good: Manufacturer obligation

Not so good: Modest levels of heat pump funding

 Bad: Still no properly-funded energy efficiency programme
